THE TRIP AND THE ROUTE:

The world Famous Jeepers Jamboree starts in Georgetown at sunrise on Thursday and Friday mornings. Vehicles go east over approximately 25 miles of paved road and 20 miles of dirt road to Wentworth Springs. About 22 miles above Georgetown the road crosses the dam at Lake Edson and passes the old cattleman's stop of Uncle Tom's Cabin. The road winds through forests of virgin pine and fir timber. At Wentworth Springs the going gets tough, almost all 4-wheel drive at 3 to 5 mles per hour. The trail goes across granite slabs ground smooth by glaciers, past the Devil's Postpile over thousands of tons of boulders, and through occassional streams. The trail passes Spider and Buck Island Lakes (Loon and Rock Bound Lakes are visible in the distance). Rubicon Springs (alt. 6500 ft.), our overnight spot, was an early 1870 mineral springs resort.

Sunday we depart with a few more miles of tough going and then paved highway at Homewood. From there it is a pleasant drive to the south end of Lake Tahoe for a farewell dinner at the Elks Club.

In Georgetown: Limited motel and hotel accommodations are available. There are good eating spots in Georgetown. Campsites are available near town. The Rubicon Trail will be closed for the exclusive use of the Jeepers Jamboree. Rubicon Springs will be leased exclusively for the Jamboree. There will be express lines at Georgetown and Rubicon for Breakfast of coffee, juice and rolls. There will be music and entertainment Friday night in Georgetown and Friday and Saturday nights in Rubicon Springs.

THREE WATER TRUCKS will be used to keep the dust settled on

the road between Georgetown and Wentworth Springs.

Mileages: Georgetown to Wentworth Springs, 45; Wentworth to Rubicon, 71/2; Rubicon to Chambers at Tahoe, 91/2; Georgetown from Sacramento, 48; to Placerville, 16; to Auburn, 19.


